#### **Food Pantry**


The Food Pantry continues to thrive!



## **Worship Ministries**

#### Soli Deo Gloria

Johann Sebastian Bach was a devout Lutheran, who believed his music was a calling from God. Bach united his faith with his music by writing instrumental compositions to accompany different hymns and biblical texts. He believed that music was a powerful way to compliment the Word and communicate the truth of scripture. Bach was dedicated to creating and performing beautiful, theologically rich arrangements. Praising God and proclaiming the great things He has done.

Bach's faith was central to his life and he

applied it to all aspects of his work. Much of his career was spent writing music for Lutheran churches. In the last twenty-seven years of his life, he wrote and usually performed a series of poetic songs and cantatas to interact with the chief hymn, reflect on the bible reading and prepare the congregation for the sermon each Sunday. Bach recognized that worship should not be drudgery. He strove to create music that would lift the heart and energize the soul.

Bach wrote his music, not for praise, but to bring God glory and bless others. All Bach's compositions were signed with J.J. for Jesu Java (Jesus Help) at the beginning and S.D.G. for Soli Deo Gloria (Glory To God Alone) at the end; reminding himself that music was a gift of God. He was merely a steward of that precious gift. Bach felt that he was working for God. And that God deserved only the best.
